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Matt Francis 21.5.1971-24.10.2023

Matthew David Francis was a man with true community spirit. Always the first to volunteer to help out, no matter what task, event or role was entailed. If it was for community, Matt was there for it. His loss leaves a great void that will be impossible for one person to fill.

Matt was a member of the CCA Management Committee from 2019 and worked tirelessly to ensure that community events and activities, in particular, were planned and run for maximum benefit and effect. Whether it was community meetings, forums or clean up days, Matt was front and centre, often fetching and carrying people or equipment in his famous blue Kombi van. Often this work was done after hours or squeezed in when his 'real job' would allow it.

An enthusiastic volunteer with the Copa Bushcare group; a past President of Copa Tennis Club, a supporter of the Kincumber Rotary Club and Care4Coast ...these are just some of the organisations and people who have lost a friend and champion.

One of Matt's major community achievements was as lead convenor of Copa Carols in 2019, a huge event staged over a whole day in December with market stalls, kids activities, a big stage where fifteen acts performed well into the night before crowds of over five hundred people. He worked himself into the ground fundraising and organising to ensure the day was a roaring success.

Matt was Treasurer of the Kincumber Neighbourhood Centre in his 'spare' time. The Manager of the Centre, Leanne Clarke, commented at his memorial that they would 'never find anyone as good as Matt' for the role. We can relate.



Matt was Deputy Captain of Copa RFB and just prior to his death, he'd spent five days in Kempsey fighting fires. Over the years he had multiple deployments and accolades for his service. Shane Hughes spoke movingly to a packed house about Matt's enormous contribution to the RFB in his eulogy at Matt's memorial service.





Summer is here – time for a skin check





Here in Copa, we all enjoy our beach and outdoor lifestyle and now that the sun is finally out, it's an ideal time to get your skin checked right here at Copacabana Medical Centre, where Dr Risto and Dr Diana offer comprehensive skin checks and an informed medical opinion as well as treatment, including skin surgery.

You may be eligible for a free Shingles vaccination.

Ask our friendly staff.

What is skin cancer?

Skin cancer is an uncontrolled growth of abnormal cells in the skin. There are three main types of skin cancer – in order of frequency: basal cell carcinoma (BCC), squamous cell carcinoma (SCC) and melanoma.

Skin cancers can present as pigmented or non-pigmented moles but can also appear as pearly papules or red scaly lesions that itch, bleed or look inflamed, and/or as scars or recurrent or non-healing ulcers. However, many remain asymptomatic and thus require regular full body skin checks for early detection.

How common is it?

Australia has one of the highest rates of skin cancer in the world. Skin cancer is the most common cancer diagnosed in Australia. As many as 2 of 3 Australians will be diagnosed with some form of skin cancer before the age of 70.

What is the danger?

If left untreated, melanoma, invasive SCC and some other less common skin cancers readily spread to other body parts (i.e. metastasize) and can be deadly. BCC is a slow growing skin cancer which rarely metastasize but spreads locally destroying every tissue/organ it encounters.

Treatment

In early stages, most skin cancers are curable by surgical excision under local anaesthesia.

Prevention is the best way to treat skin cancer.

You should:

- Avoid exposure to direct sunlight between 10am and 4pm
- · Cover up with a hat, shirt, and sunglasses
- · Avoid tanning and never use UV tanning beds
- Apply (and regularly reapply) broad spectrum UVA/UVB (ideally SPF 50+) for all outdoor activities
- Examine your skin from head to toe at least monthly
- Visit your GP annually (or as otherwise recommended) for a skin check.

We encourage you to book an appointment at Copacabana Medical Centre for a full body skin check.

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
Copacabana SLSC UPDATE

The beach patrol season has started again for Copacabana SLSC. A warm welcome to community members who will be swimming and having fun at Copacabana beach this summer! The season has kicked off to a fantastic start with the club now having a healthy membership of 417 members consisting of 95 active members who patrol our beach, 182 junior members and 140 associate or Life Members. So, we are full steam ahead for the 2023/24 surf lifesaving season!

Our Surf Patrols have been very active in keeping Copacabana beach safe since the season started on September 24th. We also have a number of members training for their Bronze Medallion and Senior Resuscitation Certificates (SRC). This season our Rookies

(over 14 years) are heading to Tamworth to participate in a "Beach to Bush" networking opportunity with students from Farrer Memorial Agricultural High School to do some of the SRC training course there. The students from Tamworth will then come to Copacabana beach to complete their water safety component of the course. We also offer a number of other surf lifesaving education courses, so if you are interested contact education@copacabanslsc.org.au.

This is the club's 60th year and to mark this achievement we are organising a number of events over the weekend of 24/25 Feb 2024. There will be a gala ball for members and events on the green for community members. Keep your eye out on our socials and website for details.

A message from Penny Hooper — Relieving Principal

Copacabana Public School turns 40

Copacabana Public School was officially opened in 1983. Earlier this term our school celebrated this milestone event with a 40th Birthday photo K-6; 80s themed Mufti Day; Past Staff and Present Students Assembly and a Commemorative Newsletter.

Thank you to Mr Rod Watson, Mrs Gai McMurtie and Mrs Sue Lewis for attending our assembly, alongside previous staff members and students. We thank you for helping to make this event so special for our students and community.







Copacabana Public School History

Early in the 1920s there were only five children living at Copacabana. The Chapmans - Dodo and her brother Ted - were the only ones attending school, riding all the way to Kincumber School on their pony. This happened for many years, with children from Copacabana attending school at either Avoca or Kincumber Public School. Avoca school eventually became overcrowded, and the site did not allow for expansion. By then most Copacabana children were attending Kincumber Public. As the population of Copa and Kincumber was continuing to increase, it was obvious the Department of Education needed to open a new school.



At a well-attended meeting in 1982 at the Copacabana Surf Club, Mr. Fairbairn (Inspector of Schools, Woy Woy) and Mr. Ken Ison (Principal, Kincumber) outlined the arrangements for the new school. They announced that a fully demountable Departmental School would be operating in 1983 at Copacabana on public land - where the tennis courts are now standing. This school would be used for approximately five years until a permanent school was constructed on the Departmental land adjacent to the school. Copacabana PS opened in 1983 with 170 students, with Mr Bruce Barnier as Principal.

The P&C worked extremely hard holding functions to raise money for school equipment. With financial support from Kincumber School and full co-operation from the Copacabana Fire Brigade and Surf Club, the whole population of Copacabana was assisting the newly established school. The school Fetes, Musicals, Bands, Open Days, Family Fun days and Presentation assemblies have all remained fixtures at the school for the past 40 years.

Plans were drawn up for the new school on flat land and after a few minor alterations, work commenced on the permanent school in April, 1986. The new school was occupied on Monday, 17 August, 1987 with two x 4 classroom blocks, a practical activity area, a Library, Admin block, Hall and Canteen. In 1988 the enrolment was 260. Today as we celebrate 40 years, we have 11 classrooms and 278 students. I would like to extend a heartful thank you to our community and take the time to wish everyone a safe and Merry Christmas. – *Penny Hooper*

To honour his memory and service, Copacabana 9, a Toyota Landcruiser that Matt often used during his deployments, has been respectfully dedicated to him, with his name now adorning the back window. This gesture stands as a lasting tribute to his commitment and spirit.



Our brigade has been vigorously involved in various critical operations. We've dispatched multiple crews on intensive five-day strike missions to both Kempsey and Lightning Ridge, confronting challenging fire conditions. Locally, we've combated bushfires in Killcare, where we were assisted by the Fireattack helicopters, showcasing our ability to effectively manage and mitigate fire threats in our community.

Amidst these demanding operations, our community engagement activities have also flourished. Our cake stall events have been a resounding success, drawing enthusiastic support from the community. Buoyed by this success, we are excitedly planning another such event in the new year, aiming to bring together community members and foster a spirit of unity and support.

As the year draws to a close, we look forward to our most cherished annual tradition: the Santa lolly runs. This event, deeply ingrained in our community's culture, has been a highlight for over 50 years. It's not just a festive celebration but also a symbol of the bond between the fire brigade and the community we serve. This year, on Saturday the 23rd of December, we will proudly escort Santa through the streets of Kincumber. The excitement will reach its peak on Christmas Eve, as we accompany Santa on his journey through Copa. The sound of our sirens will herald the joyous occasion, bringing smiles and festive cheer to the faces of residents, both young and old. These runs are more than just a tradition; they're a reminder of the warmth, camaraderie, and community spirit that define us.
