## **Hello Friends and Neighbours**

Yes, that's right, we are almost at the end of another year and I'm happy to report once again it has been very quiet crime wise in Copa. Break & enter, stealing from vehicles and malicious damage incidents are significantly down, and other categories are stable.

Our thanks go to Copa residents for responding to requests to always immediately report any crime or suspicious behaviour to Police. We have been told that crime rates have plummeted on the Central Coast due to a number of factors:

- **Proactive Policing**
- **Use of modern technology**
- **Ability of Police cars now to act as mobile stations**
- **Installation of CCTV in most Central Coast areas**
- **Assistance from residents in reporting crime and suspicious behaviour urgently**

With Christmas approaching, holidays and celebrating, unfortunately there is evidence that these are the most dangerous times for domestic violence incidents, particularly straight after holidays. Generally this is when call centres go "ballistic", with mostly women seeking help. As has been reported widely in news media, help is not always urgently requested and consequently several women have been violently assaulted and even murdered across the country. This is a very sad state of affairs and we urge all Copa residents to be vigilant.

**A few safety tips** for people going away on holidays, which may seem obvious but bear repeating as many Break & Enters occur during the holiday season.

- Lock windows as well as doors.
- If you are going away, ask a trusted neighbour to clear your letterbox and park their car in your driveway sometimes, keep lawns short and advise where you can be contacted.
- Stop all deliveries you are expecting.
- Be sure your phone message and social media pages do not say you are on holidays.
- Prepay any service bills (electricity, gas, phone) so that supply continues.
- Lock your electricity meter box - avoid power stealing. For more info contact your provider.
- Use sensor lighting and an electronic security alarm if you have them.
- Avoid packing your vehicle the night before you leave, as it could become an attractive target for thieves and 'advertise' that you're going away.

Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year to all. Enjoy your holidays.



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# Copa Surf Life Saving Club

*welcomes children to our Nippers program*

Every Sunday morning from October to March, you will see a group of excited youngsters down at the beach participating in Copa Nippers program with kids from their own age group and the broader Nippers squad groups.

Nippers is for children aged 5yrs+ at September 30 (i.e. if your child is aged 9, they will be in the U10 group). It's a fun way for kids to learn about beach safety and get involved in a healthy, outdoor activity with their peers. They can also participate in surf competitions and interact with kids from other local surf clubs.

There are three Club Championship /Point Score sessions throughout the season for U8 to U14 age groups, where points are recorded for each child in each event and the best two point score days results are used to award age champion titles.



These point score days are also used for team selections for carnivals. U6 and U7 age groups also participate in point score days and are awarded place ribbons on the day. However these age groups are not awarded age championships – because they're all "Champions" of course!

Nippers runs from 9:00 to 10:00am with parent / guardian sign-ins by 8.45am. During the season there are "Twilight" Nippers on a Saturday afternoon.

The Nippers program focuses on both surf education and fun and

is a great way to foster team spirit and camaraderie. It's also a good way for parents to get to know other families, especially if they are new to Copa. Artie's Place can sell you a great coffee or bacon and egg roll to enjoy while you watch the kids do their stuff.

## A cultural landmark since 1948

*The iconic Avoca Beach Picture Theatre may have been the first open air cinema in NSW.*

In 1951 our neighbouring village of Avoca Beach only had 400 residents, yet locals and holidaymakers alike flocked to Norman & Mervyn Hunter's garden film screenings. In those days, tickets could be had for a few pennies.

This enthusiastic patronage gave Norman and Mervyn the confidence to build a 500 seat theatre, convinced that cinema-goers would enthusiastically support the venture. They turned up in droves, and have continued to do so for seventy years.

A ten minute drive from Copacabana, the Cinema is a wonderful reminder of the grandeur of theatres past, with its' red velvet curtains and retro décor, complete with stage and two grand pianos. The bar and gardens provide a special experience and a charming alternative to the somewhat soulless multiplexes most of us are used to. Situated at the south end of the beach, it is a perfect location for a great time out.

Norman Hunter's son Norman and wife Beth have managed the Theatre since 2006 and created a real community hub, with showings of a broad variety of films - including foreign films - as well as plays, concerts, live performances and other sold out events. Monthly 'Showtime Luncheons' and the regular 'Girls Night Out' are very popular and Directors Screenings are particularly appreciated by local film buffs and enthusiasts.

A recent première screening of 'Breath' (a surfing movie based on Tim Winton's book) and a Q & A with Director Simon Baker was a hugely popular event, greatly enjoyed by all who were lucky enough to have a seat.

**When the weather permits, outdoor screenings are held in the gardens and are great fun. There's a twice-weekly Film Group, now in its 15th year, and newcomers are always welcome. Norman and Beth also assist with many community fundraising activities and they are great supporters of local causes and issues.**

Over the decades the 'bones' of the original building have remained largely unchanged. There are exciting plans in place for a new extension to increase screens and film choices with the character of the Theatre respectfully retained, enabling the Theatre to continue serving the community for the next seventy years.

Avoca Beach Picture Theatre has been mentioned in UK and American magazines as a unique cultural destination, and in Australia it has won tourism awards as well as being awarded 'Best Regional Cinema' on many occasions. We are lucky to have it on our doorstep and hope you'll get along to one of the many great screenings on offer over the summer months.






## Copacabana Men's Shed *Update*

# Copa RFS Brigade by Matt Francis

We are very grateful that the start of the fire season has been wetter than predicted, with above average rainfall also predicted for December and January. However, residents are reminded to be vigilant, as it can only take a few warm days to dry things out and the landscape to become more prone to fires.

We have been active in community engagement, holding a successful **'Get Ready'** day in September, the graduation of a group of young cadets from Kincumber High School and attending the Kincumber Public School Fête. As always, the smoke house was a big

hit with the kids, showing them what it's like to move through a smoky room, which also gave us time to engage with parents about having a plan and ensuring they are ready if an incident occurs.

The Brigade will be turning out to support *Copacabana Community Carols*, with our trucks being used as an extra barrier between the open road and the audience. We also have fundraising organised at Erina Fair on 14th and 21st December. As an addition to our normal fundraising we have also secured a **'donation tap point'** so you can use **tap and go** to make a \$2 donation which will be useful, as fewer purchases are made with cash nowadays.

The Brigade has a rigorous training schedule to ensure we keep our skills up to date, and we have been upskilling new members with formal RFS qualifications, with two members recently being awarded the level of Village Firefighter. These members will now move on to train as Breathing Apparatus Operators to enable them to respond to structure fires.

From August through October we have been fairly quiet, with only 29 call outs. We have had excellent member attendance and very quick response times, a solid effort by the brigade.

Initially, Risto will be the sole doctor but there are prospects of another doctor joining the surgery in the very near future. The practice will have rooms available for allied health services, a nurse and pathology. It also has a theatre room for skin cancer surgery and minor procedures.
